Cost of living has made decent housing more out of reach for everyone. A strong government is able to protect different types of homes in our communities. Family-sized units, affordable workforce housing, and healthy solutions for seniors, are needed for all our neighbours to remain here.



We need real rules to protect affordability.

VOTE FOR.. housing solutions

The province decides on rules for rent control, increases for new tenants (vacancy decontrol), and requiring affordable units in new developments. Changing planning rules so developers can keep building unaffordable supply leaves the actual housing crisis unsolved.



Ask candidates to build non-market housing.

VOTE FOR.. fair healthcare

Hospitals have been forced to close operating rooms or reduce hours, yet funding increased for private agency staff and clinics costing taxpayers up to 3x more. Some of these clinics illegally bill patients extra. Changing healthcare rules like Bill 60 for more privatization creates a two-tier system.



We need good rules to protect OHIP access.

FEBRUARY 27TH

VOTE FOR.. fair healthcare

Underinvestment in hospitals, long-term care, and family doctors, is breaking our system. Ontario ranks last in Canada on health and social spending, while reporting billions in surplus. Underspending means our hospitals have not been able to retain and recruit needed staff.



Ask candidates to fix our health safety net.

VOTE FOR.. **supporting our schools**

In Ontario's \$1 trillion economy, our public schools received \$1,500 less per student this school year (compared to 2018). When we go backwards on making strong education investments, children have to stay in classrooms that are unsafe, understaffed, and too overcrowded.



We need the right rules to protect their future.

Did you know \$1 of public education spending = \$1.30+ in economic benefits for Ontarians? While each dollar taken results in higher healthcare, social support, and policing costs. Not being able to do the math properly on education funding means falling behind on learning we can't afford to.
